Plagiarism (copying work from another source without giving proper credit) is unacceptable. If you plagiarize on any assignment you will earn a "0" on that assignment.

6. Use polite and appropriate language

- Offensive, derogatory, and profane terms are not tolerated. In order to have a safe classroom environment where all students feel comfortable, no put downs, swear words, or slang words with demeaning connotations will be accepted.
- 7. Do NOT touch or mess with any equipment or chemicals in the classroom without permission from Mr. French. To disregard this could result in harm, serious injury, or teleportation to a universe without electronics or pizza.
- 8. Respect, the most important of all classroom expectations and any lack thereof towards the instructor or fellow students will not be tolerated. Whether or not you like someone will not correlate to the amount of respect you give to that person.
